

Board Policy

Interscholastic athletics are established in the Shelley Joint School District No. 60 to give individuals a chance to perform against others either as an individual or on a team.

Suggested Implementation Guidelines

In order to implement the above policy, the following guidelines are established:

- A. Requirements for competition shall comply with the Idaho High School Activities Association (IHSAA) and Shelley Joint School District No. 60 regulations. They are as follows:
1. The IHSAA requires that an athlete receive a physical examination after May 1st of the athlete's 8th or 10th grade year, and have on record with the school the Interim Questionnaire prior to his/her first practice. Physicals are required prior to the first day of practice in the 9th and 11th grades. A student will not be required to have an additional physical examination during the 10th and 12th grades unless:
 - a) The physician recommends the student have an additional examination.
 - b) The parents request an examination via the Interim Questionnaire.
 - c) Affirmative answers on 1-9 of the Interim Questionnaire indicate the possible need for a repeat physical examination.
 - 1) It will be the responsibility of the school principal to consult with a licensed physician regarding any answers to questions given on the athletic Interim Questionnaire which may indicate a possible need for a repeat "annual" physical examination.
 - d) A transfer athlete had a physical examination during the preceding year in another state.
 - e) The student did not participate in athletics in the 9th or 11th grades while a Shelley High School student.
 2. The original completed Idaho Health Examination and Consent Form must be on file at the school prior to the first day of practice.
 3. The Interim Questionnaire is a consent form to be completed by the parents of the athlete. The original is given to the Principal of the school. This consent is to be completed each year of participation. The form must be on file in the Principal's office prior to the first day of practice.

4. On the date of any interscholastic athletic activity, the student participating in such event must attend five (5) full classes on the day of the activity.
5. No student is to take part in interscholastic athletics unless the student has taken out athletic insurance through the school or be able to show proof that he or she is covered by a family policy.
 - a) The building principal must inform parents/guardians of the coverage and limits of protection of the athletic insurance policy as provided by the school.
 - b) Hospital, or other medial expenses, due to injuries of athletes, either in practice or contests, are not a financial responsibility of the district. Students participate at their own risk and with parental approval.
