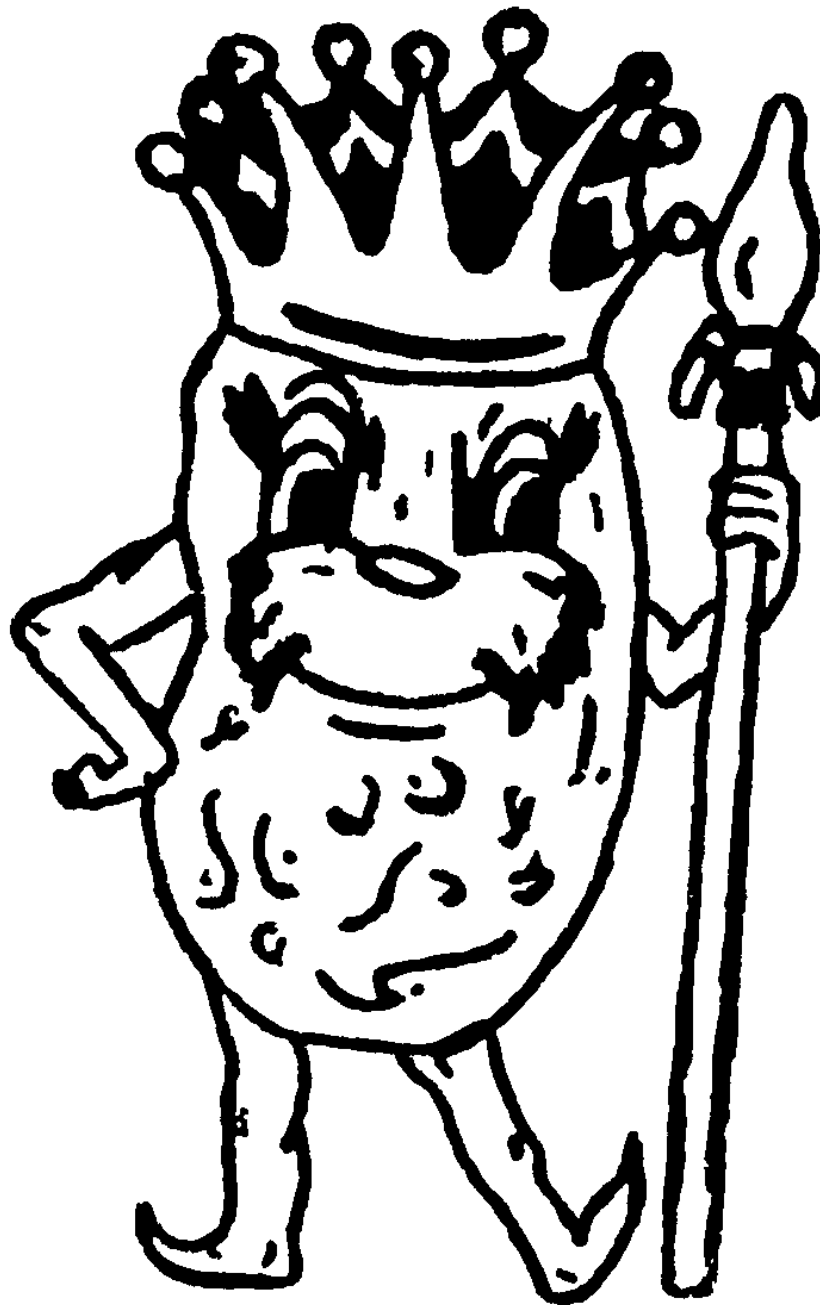

## **Community Profile**

**Shelley, Idaho has a population of over 3,800 people residing within the city limits (refer to Table 1).**

**Shelley is located in Bingham County just 10 miles South of Idaho Falls. Our proximity to Idaho Falls gives us access to EIRMC, the largest medical facility in Eastern Idaho, as well as Eastern Idaho Technical College and university extensions from Idaho State University and the University of Idaho.**

**Shelley is a community with a strong presence in the agricultural community. We have several potato processing plants located here in Shelley with several others in close proximity to us. There have been many businesses that have been developed around the work being conducted at the INL (Idaho National Laboratory) which was built west of Idaho Falls more than 50 years ago.**

**As the communities around us continue to grow in population, we have experienced high rates of families moving into the Shelley area. This can be attributed to the relaxed lifestyle and hometown atmosphere that Shelley offers. To deal with the recent influx of students, the patrons of District 60 have passed a school bond to build a new elementary school, remodel another elementary school, and eventually build a new high school. We have found that the patrons of Shelley School District 60 are very supportive of the district and understand our need for new and improved facilities.**

## Shelley High School Student Profile

Shelley High School has experienced continued growth over the past several years. At the beginning of our 2008 – 2009 school year, approximately 60 more students showed up for school that had not been pre-registered. Shelley High School currently has a student population of 650 students in grades 9 – 12. With the increase in our general student population, we have seen an increase in the percentage of minority students, primarily in the Hispanic population. There are 215 students on free and reduced lunch and 50 students receiving Special Education services.
