

1.0 PURPOSE To help with traffic regulation, safety, and identification of strangers on the Shelley High School campus.

2.0 DEFINITIONS

2.1 Driveways: The west, east, and south entrances, the section between the school and the faculty parking lot, and the areas between the designated parking spaces in the student parking lot.

3.0 PROCEDURE

3.1 Vehicle Operation on Campus: Students will be held responsible for the safe operation of their vehicles while on campus and will not be allowed to violate the law or operate a vehicle without proper insurance and license.

3.1.1 Buses will always have the right of way on campus

3.1.2 School personnel and students must enter the campus using either the west or the south entrance.

3.1.3 The east exit is an exit only.

3.2 Parking Vehicles on Campus: All vehicles will be parked within designated parking spaces.

3.2.1 No parking is allowed in the bus lane between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on the days school is in session.

3.2.2 Parking is strictly limited to the student parking area. No student vehicles are permitted in the faculty parking area.

3.2.3 All students must be licensed and covered by insurance. The school is not responsible for the automobile or its contents.

3.2.4 There is to be no loitering in the parking lot or visitors who do not have permission.

3.2.5 The maximum posted speed limit is 15 mph. Any speed exceeding 15 mph may be cited as careless or reckless driving.

3.2.6 Student vehicles may be subject to search if there are reasonable grounds to believe that drugs, alcohol, stolen property, or other contraband might be present in that vehicle.

MOTOR VEHICLE/DRIVING POLICY

- 3.2.7 Parking regulations are strictly enforced. Drivers who violate the Motor Vehicle/Driving Policy may be subject to having their vehicle booted or towed, and students may be subject to suspension from school, and/or the suspension/loss of their right to drive on school property.
- 3.2.8 Traffic and parking fines must be paid within 20 school days of date of issue. Failure to do so can result in the loss of driving rights on school grounds. Fines are paid in the Bookkeeper's Office in the Administration Office.
- 3.2.9 You have the right to contest any citation. It must be done within 10 days of date of issue. The High School Principal will handle all contested citations.
